

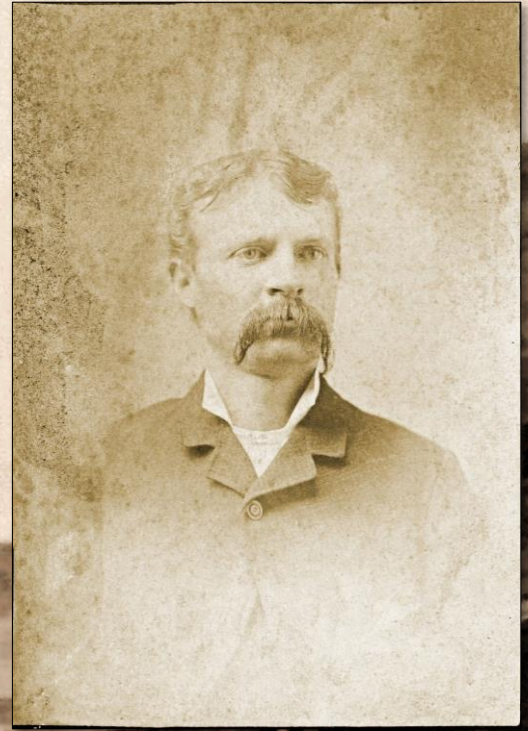

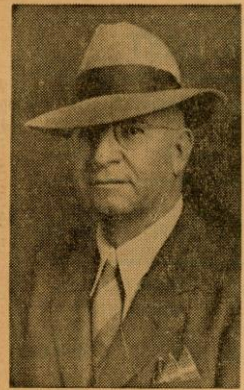

Earl Proctor Dies In City

Oscar Earl Proctor, 75, vice president and treasurer of Proctor and Proctor Inc., died Friday night at his home after an extended illness.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. today from St. Paul's Methodist Church with the Rev. Melton Ware officiating. Burial will follow in Oakland Cemetery.

Mr. Proctor was born in St. Marys, Ga., and spent his early childhood in Fernandina. He attended college in Tallahassee at the West Florida Seminary, now Florida State University.

He was a member of Trinity Methodist Church and a charter member of the Tallahassee Exchange Club. He was a life member of the Tallahassee Elks Lodge and was affiliated with numerous other civic and social organizations.

He is survived by his wife, the former Hester Williamson; two sons, Dr. Earl W. Proctor and M. Julian Proctor; two brothers, W. Theo Proctor and Ralph E. Proctor; three sisters, Mrs. C. B. McKinnon, Mrs. Malcolm McNeill and Mrs. Claude L. Johnson; and 13 grandchildren, all of Tallahassee.

Honorary pallbearers will be members of the Exchange Club and the Directors Club.

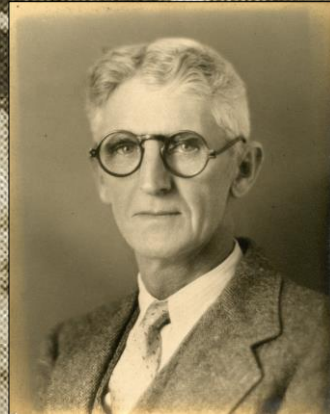
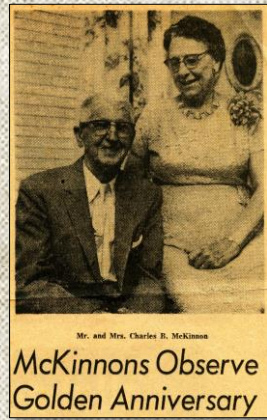

War may be painful to remember, but it's impossible to forget. So said many who gathered Thursday in Tallahassee to commemorate Veterans Day. They included Warren Ernst, 64, a Marine in World War II.

It wasn't really the parade that brought him to town, said Ernst, of St. Marks. Nor was it the free breakfast, nor the red-white-and-blue decorations at the Sault-Brigades American Legion Post 13 on Lake Ella.

It was, instead, his memories of military action, and his need to share the experience.

"I was in the Marine Corps for six weeks," he said. "I went in with 64 guys. At the end there were 32 left. So I loved the 32 twice as much."

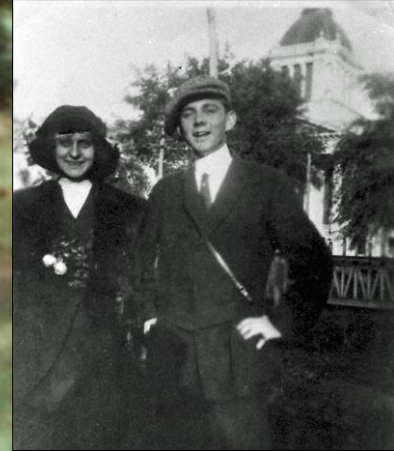

Because of its location & Ruby's statements this was assumed to his gravesite, but no previous records positively identified the grave until the Mortuary Report was found in 2016 & submitted by Doug and Dave to the Oak Grove Cemetery Authority.

Doug & Dave marked the grave with a temporary marker in Oct. 2016.

Johnson, who lived at 813 Ingle-side Ave., had been connected with the Capital City bank for 36 years.

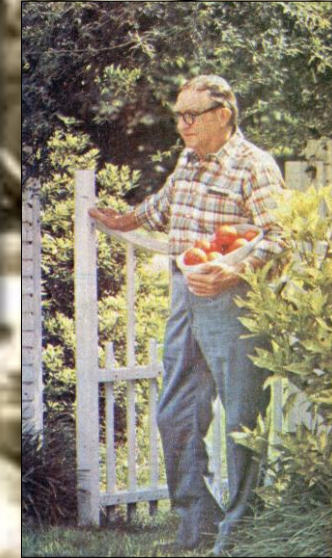

Ralph Proctor Sr., local civic leader, dies at age 80

Ralph Edward Proctor Sr., 80, prominent Tallahassee businessman, banker, and former mayor, died Tuesday at Tallahassee Memorial Regional Hospital following an aneurysm and heart attack.

Born on Amelia Island, Proctor came to Tallahassee as a youngster and later founded Ralph E. Proctor Fuel Oil Co. in 1928. He was one of the founding directors of Tallahassee Bank and Trust Co., now Barnett Bank.

Graveside services will be at 11 a.m. today at Oakland Cemetery.

"I had absolutely nothing to start with," Proctor said in a 1976 interview. But he believed in the American Dream — "if people are willing to work for it."

Ralph E Proctor was elected mayor of Tallahassee as past city commissioners and municipal officials attended the annual reorganization meeting Friday night at City Hall.

The commission voted to retain the present city officials: City Manager Malcolm Yancey, City Auditor and Clerk George C White, City Judge Walter T Moore, Jr. and City Attorney James Messer, Jr. for another year.

Retiring Mayor Charles S Austey, recently elected state senator, was presented with a letter of appreciation of his services signed by city employees. The oath of office was administered to George I Martin, new commissioner, by Judge Moore.

Commissioner Fred Winterle nominated Proctor for mayor. Winterle himself was elected mayor pro tem.

The reorganization meeting followed the annual banquet of past commissioners and officials at the Florida hotel. Several of the group spoke at the closed dinner.

HISTORY OF ST. MARYS AND CAMDEN COUNTY

CHAPTER 45
RECONSTRUCTION
After 1865, and the close of the War Between the States, old citizens of St. Marys slowly returned, but there are no records of city affairs before the latter part of 1867, when General Pope, on October 3, appointed James Lippman, as Mayor of St. Marys and Joseph Arnow, John Grovenstine and William Proctor, as members of City Council; this Joseph Arnow

On April 4th, at a city election, William Proctor was elected Mayor and Joseph Arnow, R. D. Fox, John Grovenstine and Charles Briggs were elected Councilmen. Mr. Proctor refused to qualify as Mayor and there are no minutes to show who served, but on April

On April 5th, 1869, a City election was held, and the following were elected: for Mayor, F. M. Adams, and for Aldermen, Joseph Arnow, William Proctor, Augustus Mitchell and John S. Grovenstine.

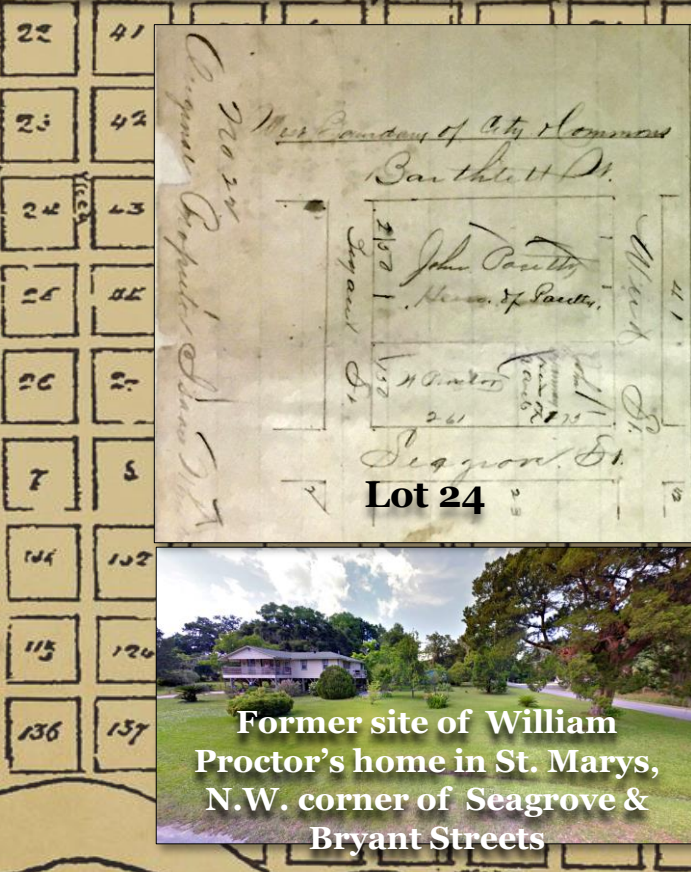
On May 29, Aldermen Arnow and Proctor were appointed a committee, and directed to "take all necessary steps to have two more of the city pumps put in order," and at the July meeting, the committee reported that wooden pumps could be purchased in Savannah, at \$2.00 per foot, while "the necessary gear for working the pumps could be procured for about ten dollars each".
In October, the committee (with Alderman Dennis Pacetty added),

reported four pumps almost ready for use and recommended that the bill of \$172.00 be paid.

These large wooden pumps were evidently first used before the War Between the States, and were all placed either at or near street crossings. The writer recalls six or seven that were in use when

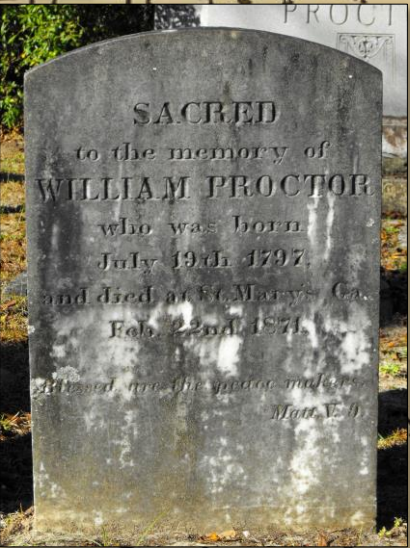


St. Marys Wooden Pump

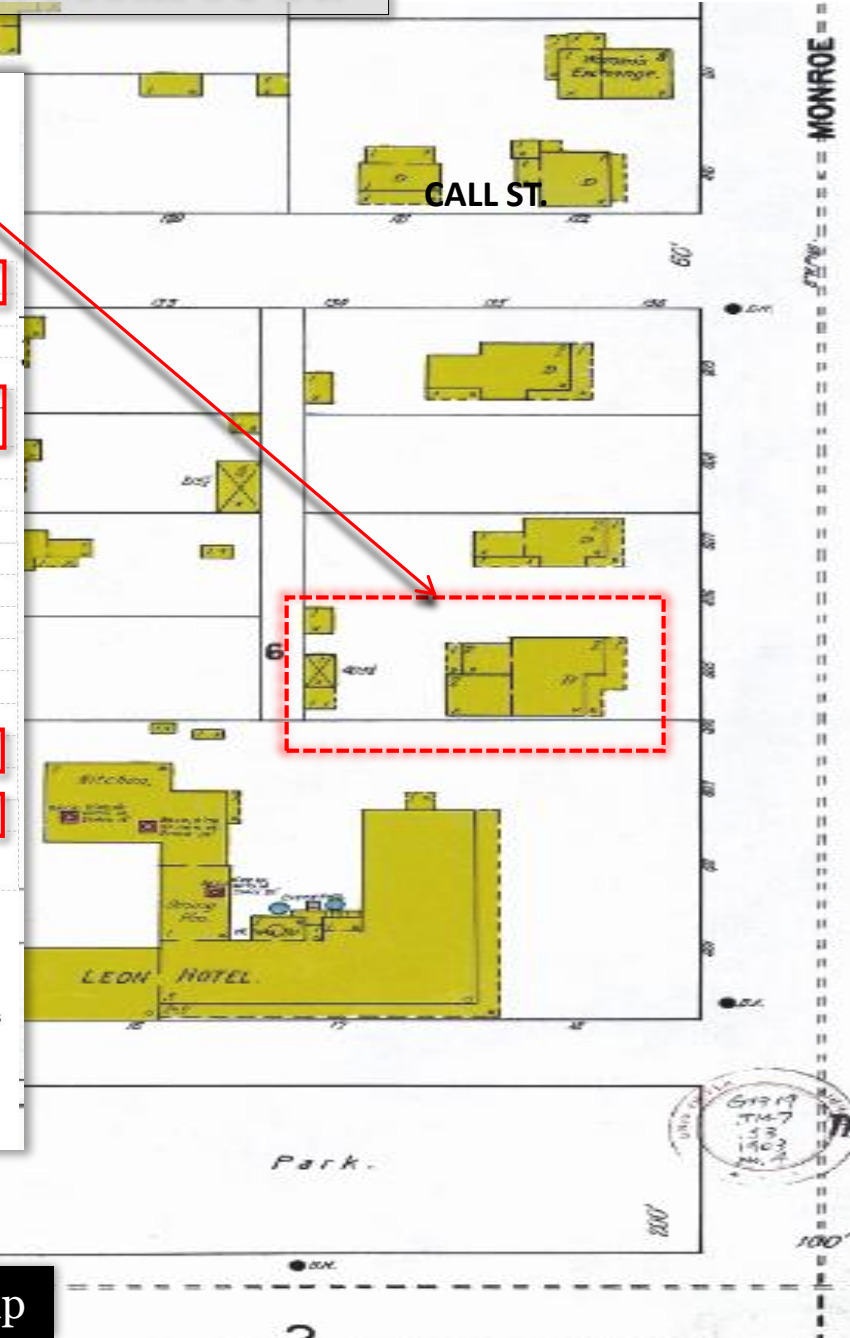

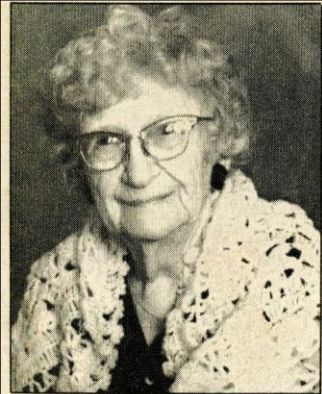

In addition, she had been nominated three times for Tallahassee Volunteer of the Year for teaching piano.

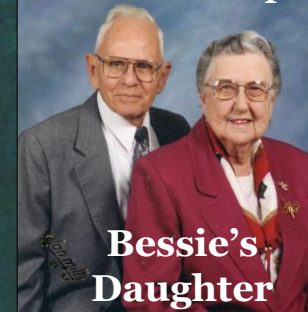

Temple was employed by the city for 38 years. He joined the utility department in 1918 and worked up through the ranks to superintendent. Leon County's



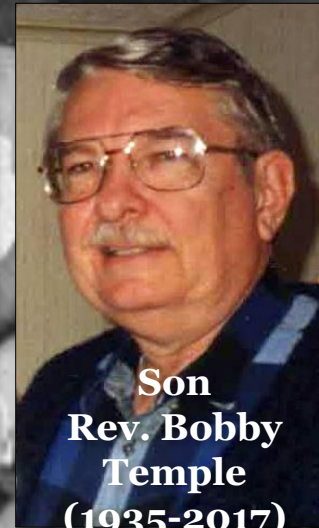

Saxon died 2 days later.

OBITUARY.

Another noble hearted spirit is gone. God in his infinite wisdom has seen fit to remove from Time to Eternity EDWARD H. F. SAXON, son of Rev. HENRY SAXON. He died at Palatka, Florida, July 20th, 1862, in the 19th year of his age. Typhoid fever, that fell destroyer, was the cause of his untimely Death. EDWARD H. F. SAXON was a member of Capt. BLOXHAM'S company, and by his gentlemanly deportment, he won the admiration and esteem of both officers and men. He was kind, courteous, obliging and truly pious and religious—he was a young man of great personal worth—those who knew him best loved him most—none knew him but to love him. He was the pride and idol of his affectionate mother, a dutiful son and devoted brother. When the call for volunteers was made, notwithstanding the solicitations of his mother, he could not be persuaded doing what he considered his duty, which was to volunteer in his country's cause.— Even in his last moments he expressed a wish that he might be spared to help to fight his country's battles. But he was cut down in the bloom of his youth. Thus has passed away a true patriot and a good soldier. He leaves an affectionate mother, three brothers, four sisters and numerous relatives and friends to sorrow for his doom. But they weep not, hoping and believing as they do that their loss is his eternal gain.

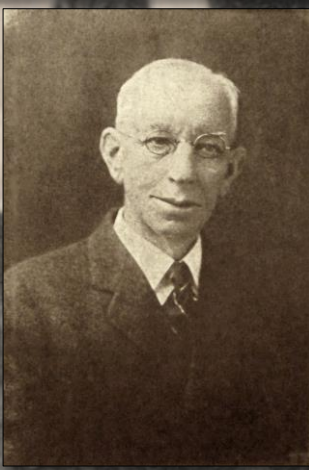
